

## Supporting teachers of A level

I was handed a large, hard backed tome. Inside was a slip of paper containing a list of numbers. "Do those chapters", the head of department said. The other teacher will do the rest. The head of department walked away. I was 22 years old, straight out of teacher training, staring my first job. This was the 'support' and 'advice' I received before starting teaching my first A level class. The other teachers of A level in the department were all busy people and I didn't feel I knew them well enough go ask for advice or for help when I got stuck. It was sink or swim. A lot of long nights preparing and sleepless nights worrying.

This was a long time ago and thankfully times have changed. There is a plethora of support on offer for teachers of A level from the Advanced Maths Support Programme (AMSP). But what I needed back then, was not to be sent on a course, but the opportunity to meet with a group of A level teachers, from other schools, to share resources, experiences and to meet with people in whom I could confide and ask for help. This is exactly what the A level Pedagogy Workgroup, run by the Yorkshire Ridings Maths Hub, provides.

The workgroup is led by experienced teacher of A level mathematics, Saima Binning. The theme of the workgroups is how to integrate problem solving into your A level teaching, but there will be ample time to raise other concerns and queries. The group is ideal not only for teachers early in their A level teaching career, but for more experienced teachers of A level who want to develop their own pedagogy and wish to share their experience with colleagues.
